Resolution

A resolution of the Board of Trustees of the Kerrville Independent School District endorsing the **TEXCARE** partnership –
A Children's Health Insurance Campaign

WHEREAS, the Kerrville Independent School District Board of Trustees resolves to endorse the **TexCare Partnership**, a new children's health insurance campaign developed especially for Texas families.

According to Texas statistics, more than 1.4 million children are uninsured. The campaign covers children from birth through age 18. The Texas Legislature enacted the Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP) in 1999.

The CHIP program is one of three separate health insurance programs for Texas children provided by the new **TexCare Partnership**, which formed to help pay for health insurance. This program is open to individuals who are U.S. citizens or legal permanent residents. The CHIP program is paid for by federal funds plus part of the money Texas received for settling liability claims against the tobacco industry.

Children who have not had insurance before will have the benefit of the **TexCare Partnership** which provides regular checkups, shots, eye exams, glasses, prescription drugs, specialist care, dental care, mental health care, x-rays, lab tests, hospital care and services.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE KISD THAT we support and endorse the **TEXCARE** partnership.
