

Lynda Leslie moved and David Hunt seconded the motion that the Board adopt the following resolution:

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees of the Kerrville Independent School District, being dedicated to insuring that the purposes for which we were elected are carried forth, namely the effective and efficient education of children under their jurisdiction, at the least cost to the taxpayer.

WHEREAS, the Kerrville Independent School District Board of Trustees did request that a study be made as to the issues involved in requiring the Kerr County Tax-Assessor-Collector to assess and collect the property taxes for all taxing units in the appraisal district for Kerr County, Texas

WHEREAS, such study was prepared from audits on file in the office of the Kerr County Clerk, the Texas Education Agency, and from the Texas Property Tax Code.

WHEREAS, such study did reveal that an expected loss of efficiency in tax collections of 4.72%, a loss of a significant amount of interest revenue, that the legally required discount granted by the County, and other assorted additional costs might well result in an additional cost to Kerrville Independent School District taxpayers of at least \$198,173.00 or at least 6% increase in school taxes.

WHEREAS, the increased cost noted above would require a decrease in service to the children of the District or a tax increase for the taxpayers of the District, it is evident that consolidation of tax offices per this petition would not be in the best interests of the children of Kerrville Independent School District or its taxpayers.

IT BEING SPECIFICALLY NOTED, that should such an election mandate consolidation, any and all control of funds for the education of children in the Kerrville Independent School District would cease.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees of the Kerrville Independent School District unanimously do wish to voice their opposition to the consolidation of tax collections in the Office of the Tax Assessor-Collector of Kerr County and urge all voters to cast ballots AGAINST the proposition.
