

George Rose moved and Byron Dahse seconded the motion that the Board approve the following resolution, and let it become part of the policy handbook:

RESOLUT.

STATEMENT OF POLICY  
(Board of Trustees)

RE: TAX RESOLUTION

The President called to the attention of the School Board the duty to supervise the assessment and collection of taxes on taxable properties, and the provisions of the laws of this State with respect to taxable property, after which the following Resolution was offered for adoption by George Rose, a member of the School Board.

WHEREAS, under the laws of the State, the School Board of the Kerrville Independent School District is advised that the adoption of any plan or scheme by the taxing authorities for the systematic and deliberate omission or exclusion of specific classes of properties from the tax rolls would entitle a complaining owner to relief; and,

WHEREAS, it is the desire and express policy of the Kerrville Independent School District that all classes and items of property subject to taxation for the year 1977 and succeeding years to be assessed for taxes at fair, equal and uniform values. It is the desire and express policy of the Kerrville Independent School District to bring about, as near as may be, full assessment of all classes and items of property subject to taxation at values which are equalized as between themselves.

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED, that said Tax Assessor is hereby instructed to assess all taxable properties at values which are fair, true and equal, and that said Tax Assessor take all means available to him to identify the ownership and value of the items and classes of taxable properties, and make a bona fide effort to assess the same for taxation to the end that it cannot be successfully charged by any person or group of persons, firms or corporations who may desire to attack the structure of the District that said items and classes of properties have been systematically or deliberately omitted or excluded from the tax rolls for the year 1977 and succeeding years.

After full discussion of the proposed Resolution, and upon the seconding of the same by member Bryon Dahse, the above Resolution was adopted.
